



Humanitarian Relief Efforts

The information presented in this report are undertaken by the Government of Iraq (GoI) and International Organizations.

Ninawa Governorate

- Between 11th and 28th December, the Ministry of Trade (MoT) distributed food items, through the Public Distribution System, to IDPs and residents in the liberated areas as follow: 1,719 boxes of cooking oil, 5,517 bags of sugar, 1,323 bags of rice, and 6,621 bags of flour, according to JCMC focal point in MoT.
- On 29th December, MoDM distributed food and relief items in the IDP camps and the liberated areas, as follow: 2,160 food parcels, 256 immediate food parcels, 1,160 jerrycans, 1,160 kitchen sets, 1,160 kerosene heaters, and 256 mats.

Holy Najaf Governorate

On 28th December, JCMC representation office reported on the relief activities in the Governorate, as outlined below:

- UNHCR distributed NFIs to 1,000 IDP families. Each family received 6 blankets, a jerrycan, and a kerosene heater.
- Alawi Holy Shrine distributed packets of milk to 6,000 IDP families in the Governorate. Each family received 3 packets of milk, where each packet weighs 350 g.
- Distribution of food rations to 9,500 IDP families in the Governorate by WFP. Each ration was composed of 30 kg of flour, 5 kg of sugar, 5L of cooking oil, 5 kg of lentil, 5 kg of chickpeas, 15 kg of rice, and 750 g of salt.

Wassit Governorate

- According to JCMC representation office on 29th December, WFP, through ISHO, distributed the December's food rations to 4,192 IDP families in the Governorate.

Holy Karbala Governorate

According to JCMC representation office, between 13th and 22nd December, relief activities were carried out in the Governorate, as outlined below:

- UNHCR distributed 1,000 winter rations, along with distribution of Kerosene to 2,000 IDP families, where each family received 200L with the barrel.
- WFP completed the distribution of December's food rations to 10,208 IDP families in the Governorate.
- In coordination between JCMC representation office, and the Governor's office, 3,000 m of sheets were provided to IDPs accommodated in the private IDP camp, in order to cover the tents during rainfall. The camp hosts over 500 IDP families.

Babil Governorate

On 28th December, JCMC representation office reported on the relief activities in the Governorate, as outlined below:

- MoDM's branch distributed 1,000 blankets, 1,000 jerrycans, 1,000 kerosene cookers, and 887 pillows to 1,000 IDP families in the Governorate.
- UNHCR distributed kerosene to 1,000 IDP families in the Governorate. Each family received 200L with the barrel.
- DRC distributed sealing-off kits (SOK) to 47 IDP families in the Governorate.



Kirkuk Governorate

According to JCMC representation office, between 21st December and 2nd January, food and non-food items were distributed to IDPs, as outlined below:

- MoDM's branch distributed 4,340 food parcels to IDP families in the Governorate. In addition, food items, non- food items, household items, shelter and transportation were provided to over 3,000 IDPs from Hawija district, who were relocated from different zones to the Governorate's camps.
- Distribution of winter clothing to 1,567 families in Laylan camp1, 721 families in Laylan camp2, and 258 families in Bawa complex, along with distribution of 500 toys to IDP children in Daquq camp.

Diyala Governorate

- On 29th December, MoDM distributed 250 dry food parcels, 250 immediate food parcels, 250 hygiene kits, and 250 kitchen sets in Qara Taba sub-district in the Governorate.

Anbar Governorate

- With contribution from the Government of Japan, UN-Habitat rehabilitated 123 houses in Tameem neighborhood in Ramadi district, Anbar Governorate for returnees' families. In addition, UN-Habitat will continue its plan to rehabilitate 304 houses in the coming period, UN-Habitat reported on 26th December.

Al-Muthana Governorate

- According to JCMC representation office on 29th December, WFP distributed 630 food parcels to 630 IDP families. Each parcel weighs 70,3 kg.

Various Governorates

- According to JCMC focal point in the Ministry of Labor and Social Affairs on 18th December, 600 blankets, 200 mattresses, 250 packets of baby milk, 200 packets of milk, 1,000 packs of baby diapers, and 6,500 clothing were distributed by the Ministry in Shirqat and Baiji districts in Salah Al-Din Governorate and Qayyara sub-district in Ninawa Governorate.
- The Ministry of Oil distributed gratis Kerosene to IDP families in KR-I, as follow: on 31st December 2016, 453,140L were distributed to 5,917 IDP families, and on 1st January 2017, 311,400L were distributed to 3,150 IDP families.

Iraqi Red Crescent Society

- Between 14th and 31st December, IRCS carried out relief activities to beneficiaries in Baghdad, Ninawa, Salah Al-Din, Babil, Holy Najaf, and Dahuk Governorates, as outlined below:

- Between 14th and 31st December, IRCS provided medical services to beneficiaries in Baghdad, Ninawa, Dahuk, Sulaimaniya, Kirkuk, Salah Al-Din, Almutana, Erbil, Diyala, Missan, and Basra Governorates, as shown in the table below:

- IRCS distributed cash grants to 1,285 IDP families in Al-Shikhan and Zakho districts. Each family received \$200.
- 45,000 beneficiaries weekly from the safe water produced through the IRCS's R.O units in Babil, Baghdad, Wassit, Karbala, and Thi-Qar Governorates, along with 2,000 beneficiaries from the water distribution centers in Anbar Governorate.
- 20,000 beneficiaries from the water treatment and purification unit in Khazir and Hassansham camps.

International Committee for Red Cross (ICRC)

- During weeks 52 and 53, ICRC provided first time food and relief items and unconditional cash grants to 7,339 households (44,034 individuals) in Anbar, Baghdad, Diyala, Babil, Kirkuk, Salah Al-Din, Ninawa, and Dahuk Governorate, as shown in the table below:

- The supply of Chlorination Units for key water treatment facilities in Wassit Governorate was completed. The Beneficiaries amount to 260,000 residents and 10,000 IDPs.
- The rehabilitation of Falahat Raw Water Pumping Station in Falahat, Taji District was completed. The beneficiaries amount to 35,000 residents and 3,000 IDPs.
- Two projects including drilling a borehole and building 5 sanitation blocks in Albu Hneihi camp north of Udham Sub-District, Diyala Governorate, were completed. The Beneficiaries amount to 600 returnees.
- The rehabilitation of Khalidiya Water compound in Khalidiya District, Anbar Governorate was completed. The Beneficiaries amount to 16,500 residents and 17,000 IDPs.
- The rehabilitation of compact units in Taza and Basheer, in Taza District, Kirkuk Governorate was completed. The project is serving around 12,000 residents and 3,390 IDPs.
- The installation of Two Boreholes in Bnaslaw and Kasnazan, Bnaslaw District, Erbil Governorate was completed. The project is serving around 23,000 residents and 2,000 IDPs.
- The rehabilitation of Mandali Water Treatment Plant, Balad Roos, Diyala Governorate was completed. The project is serving around 58,500 residents and 2,750 IDPs.

UN response to the displacement crisis due to the Ninawa liberation operations

- ❖ The United Nations announced that it has provided humanitarian assistance to the Ninawa IDPs, since the commencement of the Ninawa liberation operations on 17th October, up to 25th December, as outlined below:
 - 336,502 people received food rations sufficient for 30 days.
 - 178,881 people received (RRM).
 - 331,000 people were reached with (NFI)
 - 130,087 IDPs benefited from medical examinations.
 - 426,554 people were reached with WASH services inside and outside camps.
 - 163,419 benefited from protection services.
 - 10,479 boys and girls enrolled in temporary learning spaces.
 - Nargizlia 1 camp will be ready in the coming days, while Nargizlia 2 is expected to be ready in mid-January.

- ❖ According to WHO's report on 2nd January, the organization supplied IDP camps and Primary Health Care Centers (PHCCs) with miscellaneous medicines, as follow:
 - Provision of a quantity of miscellaneous medicines to treat IDP patients in Khazir camp, along with miscellaneous medicines sufficient to treat around 24,250 patients in Hassansham camp.
 - 150 vials of pentotsam enough to treat 150 patients with leishmaniosis were provided to Qayyarah Primary Health Centre.
 - 30 ambulances and 23 mobile medical clinics were handed over to local health facilities to support the medical response during Mosul liberation operations. An additional Mobile Medical Clinic was provided to the DOH in Ninawa to support treatment of patients in Tobzawa village where there are hundreds of returnees.
 - Medical supplies were provided to Alzahraa Primary Health Care Centre (PHCC) inside Mosul. In addition, referral forms were provided to trauma stabilization points (TSPs) in Mosul to facilitate the referral processes of patients.
